Collaboration in a wide range of externally-funded RDI projects aiming to advance combined transport, guarantee continued interoperability of infrastructure, mobile assets and digital systems, development of best practice and support services and implementing advanced digitalisation solutions.

- <u>ILU-Code:</u> owner-key registration, ILU-Register, labelling, advanced standardisation
- EDIGES: the TAF TSI-compliant communication standard of intermodal actors, terminal and customer code portal





- Rail Facilities Portal: compliance and promotion tool for rail service facilities that support freight operations
- Tracking and Tracing: CESAR, the leading system for the intermodal sector



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

Members

- Combined Transport Operators (CTOs): economic actors, who organise intermodal freight trains and assume the commercial risk for their operations. CTOs can be wagon keepers, they may also own and/or operate transhipment terminals, act as entities in charge of maintenance (ECM), and provide various additional services from positioning road legs to customs agency.
- <u>Transhipment Terminal Managers (TTMs):</u> economic actors who manage and / or own intermodal transhipment terminals - one or several.


Technology Partners

Economic actors who provide essential technologies to intermodal freight transportation, such as

- Manufacturers of intermodal loading units: containers, swap bodies and semi-trailers
- Manufacturers of intermodal wagons and skeleton trailers
- Transhipment technology manufacturers: cranes, mobile loading equipment, terminal tractors, photogates
- <u>Digital solution providers:</u> developers of IT systems for CTOs and TTMs, as well as digital solutions for intermodal logistics

CONSIGNMENTS AND TONNE-KILOMETRES (REFERENCE YEAR: 1990 = 100)



The UIRR CT Growth Index (Consignments and Tonne-Kilometres) is a time series of year-on-year growth rates of the number of consignments transported and the tonne-kilometres realised by UIRR members over the years, which has been neutralised of membership effects, i.e of companies joining or leaving the association. Hence the growth rate of only those members were taken into account in one year that were able to provide data for the previous year as well. It is assumed that prevailing UIRR membership in any year since 1990 has been representative of the trends of the entire European CT sector.
