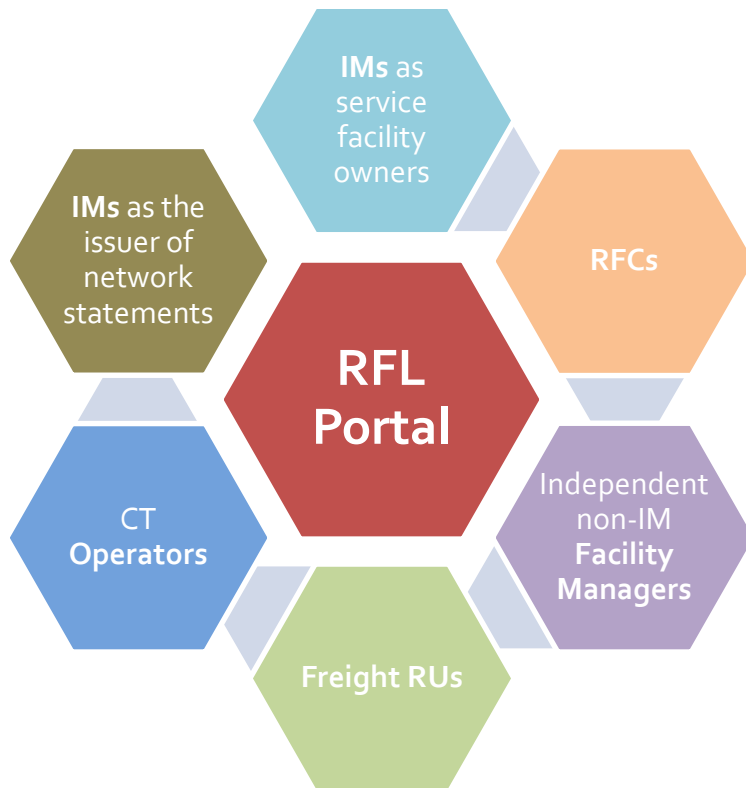

Regulation 2017/2177 – under Directive 2012/34

- 1) **Scope:** seven types of rail service facilities used by rail freight including intermodal terminals
- 2) **Exemptions:** by national regulatory bodies of strategically unimportant or fully private facilities built and operated for own use
- 3) **Service Facility Statement:** a standardized General Terms and Conditions for all facilities
- 4) **Controversial aspects:** priorities and conflicts of capacity allocation (viable alternative), languages (at least 2), communication of information (SFS, TCR, dynamic capacity availability, unused facility), the Infrastructure Managers' and the Regulatory Body's role
- 5) **Timeline:** adoption by vote of the Member States (MoT representatives), implementation within 18 months thereof
- 6) **Implementation support:** Commission to fund development of common web portal to ease publication burden



1. Creates a market-friendly/user-friendly single source of information concerning information on Service Facilities essential to operating rail freight
2. Regulatory compliance-motivated annual contracts with RFCs;
3. Assumption of the Network Statement obligations of IMs and efficient publication of information concerning their service facilities;
4. Realistic solution to notifying the 'viable alternative' and to satisfy other information provision obligations of SERVICE FACILITY MANAGERS;
5. Market-friendly/user-friendly interface-connection solution to ADVANCED DATA USERS

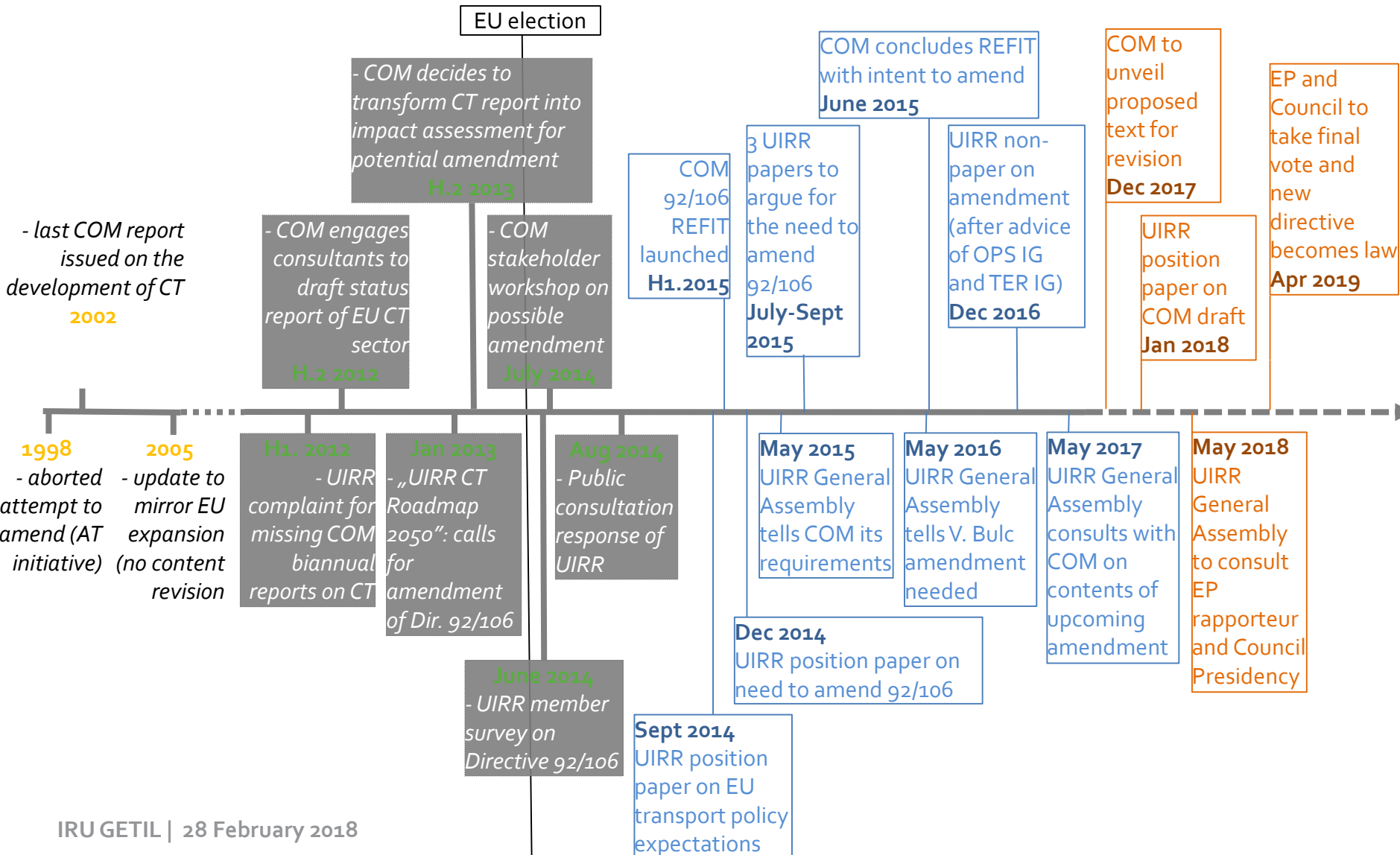

Roadmap to the amendment of Directive 92/106



---thousands of man-hours over a 7 year period (starting in 2012)





Sector Statement (improvements possible without legislative amendment)

- 1) Reducing the response time to planning request
- 2) Reducing transit times and disruptions, improving reliability (by minimising delays)
- 3) Providing tracking and tracing for shippers to be able to monitor the status of their goods
- 4) Developing a comparable set of KPIs to monitor quality of service
- 5) Working towards to common ICT architecture
- 6) Organising an annual public RFC strategy meeting at each corridor for all RAGs, TAGs and interested end-customers
- 7) Strengthening the dialogue and cooperation within the advisory groups
- 8) Compiling and annually updating a single list of important operational issues
- 9) Coordinating maintenance and construction works 24 months before timetable change
- 10) Identifying, regularly updating and publishing a list of main infrastructure bottlenecks on each corridor
- 11) Harmonisation of operational procedures of RFCs

Ministerial Declaration (Rotterdam, 2016)

- 1) Increased market orientation
- 2) Enhanced collaboration to coordinate works and development ideas
- 3) Pledged to offer coordinated infrastructure capacity
