A second consecutive positive quarter

On the back of a weaker quarter a year ago, Combined Transport's performance grew year-on-year by 1,76% during the first three months of 2025. The reopening of the Frejus line on the last day of March returned to service the most efficient and highest capacity route between France and Italy, which should be adequate cause for optimism. Nevertheless, the disruptions to global trade caused by the unexpected U.S. tariffs in combination with a lagging economic performance of the EU, leaves the UIRR CT Sentiment Index

unchanged at "neutral" for the next 12 months.

Work carried out by DB InfraGo on the railway infrastructure network in Germany as part of the concept of "Generalsanierung" (general renovation), which results in prolonged full line closures, have been leading to unprecedented difficulties for freight trains. Inferior bypass options with limited capacities place a cap on Combined Transport performance, while causing unbearable additional costs for the operators. UIRR, together with several sector associations, has been demanding compensation for these unforeseen and unusually high extra costs. They should be built into the works budgets and automatically extended to freight operators forced to use the bypass train paths.

Combined Transport, as the only dynamically growing production system of rail freight, delivers over 50% of rail freight tonne-kilometres, corresponding to about 10% of Europe's door-to-door land freight transport. The substantial upside potential of Combined Transport is rooted in its robust energy, labour, safety, infrastructure and environmental efficiency performance in comparison to the long-distance trucking alternative – as uncovered in the study published at the European Intermodal Summit in January. On these fundamentals, a large portion of the 1.000 billion tkm delivered annually by long-distance trucks could and should shift to Combined Transport.

This empirical study, the fourth produced in the context of the CT4EU Campaign, examines the efficiencies of door-to-door Combined Transport in comparison to its Euro6 diesel-powered longdistance trucking alternative. The efficiencies uncovered rhyme well with the new themes of the European Union characterised by the Clean Industrial Deal and the drive towards enhanced competitiveness and resilience. Accordingly, today's Combined Transport is 70% more energy efficient, 60% more labour efficient, 50% more infrastructure efficient and over 90% better in terms of safety and road accident prevention, CO2 and pollutant emissions. These are values that cannot be matched by any technology on the table or under consideration to improve road transport. Should Combined Transport become the backbone of longer distance land freight transport in Europe, the savings to be pocketed by citizens, economic actors and public budgets would exceed €200 billion annually.

New terminal members Afluent from Romania, CLIP from Poland, and Van Der Vlist from The Netherlands joined the UIRR Community, alongside Technical Partners Rekencentra from Belgium, Tatravagonka from Slovakia and Wascosa from Switzerland.

We look forward to continuing our mission to advance the cause of Combined Transport.



The main railway axis connecting France and Italy, Frejus, is restored

March 2025

The Frejus railway line, crippled by a major landslide in the Maurienne Valley in late August 2023, was restored to working order by the end of March. 19 months of works were needed to remove the rubble and to reinforce the mountainside to prevent any similar occurrence in the future.
