### Combined Transport growth is stalling

The good news of the Fréjus line reopening was tarnished by extreme weather, flooding and works-related disruptions throughout the European railway network, bringing the fragile recovery of Combined Transport volumes to a halt during the second quarter of 2025. Mountains of uncertainty ranging from wars, tariff-related global conflicts, the need to confront increasing public debt levels and the resulting directionless economic performance leaves the UIRR CT

Sentiment Index unchanged at "neutral" for the coming 12 months.

The General Assembly of UIRR confirmed the 2024 annual results of Combined Transport, which delivered a convincing rebound of +5,2% following two years of contraction. The composition of the UIRR Combined Transport Community changed in 2024 after the arrival of several new members but also the departures of Kombiverkehr and LINEAS. The UIRR community of operators, terminals, technology partners and peer associations presently counts 113 entities.

The April-June period of 2025 brought about several important developments for Combined Transport. The amended Wagon TSI was adopted by the Member States, which constitutes a major setback for trailer transport by rail. UIRR is currently exploring solutions that can mitigate the additional costs threatened by the revised TSI Wagon. Approval of the TSI Telematics on the other hand was postponed, giving the Combined Transport Community more time to present its arguments for a business-conform solution.

In June, UIRR attended the Transport Logistics Exhibition in Munich, the largest gathering of the sector in Europe. The European Parliament rapporteur for the revision of the Combined Transport Directive, Flavio Tosi (EPP) spoke at the event co-organised with UIRR peer association FERMERCI and the Combined Transport for Europe (CT4EU) campaign. Mr Tosi stated that he will submit his draft report to the Transport Committee upon the completion of a study undertaken by the European Parliament Research Department, which is expected in September. The European Combined Transport Community looks forward to the modernisation of the Combined Transport Directive and anticipates a continued close collaboration of the EU co-legislators: the European Parliament and the Member States in the Council.

The Combined Transport for Europe (CT4EU) campaign has continued its mission of delivering information to policy and decision-makers, as well as organising events and networking opportunities for discussing the relevant topics. Several joint statements were issued during the quarter, with more in the pipeline. The CT4EU campaign provides the opportunity to logistics service providers and shippers committed to Combined Transport to join a community that has a stronger voice together.

UIRR recognises the significant progress and compromise solutions reached by the Polish Council Presidency and the EP rapporteur of the new Railway Infrastructure Capacity Management Regulation, Ms Tilly Metz. The new Regulation will not only enable more efficient digitalised train path allocation but also secure more and better-quality train paths for intermodal freight trains, both during timetabling and when bypassing disruptions or temporary capacity restrictions (TCRs).

We look forward to continuing our mission to advance the cause of Combined Transport.

### Germany faces complaints about infrastructure availability

### Germany to limit track access charge increase for freight trains to 15%

June 2025

The Federal Ministry of Transport (BMV) presented a draft bill intended to mitigate the previously looming sharp increases in German track access charges in 2026. In freight transport, the threatened track access charge increases in 2026 could be reduced from up to 35% with the existing regional rail track access charge cap to around 15%.

# Combined Transport Directive: the outlook according to the EP rapporteur

The main obstacles to finalising the CTD lies in the rigidity of the original proposal, which EP rapporteur Flavio Tosi described as "not very attentive to the operational reality of the sector and a product of the Green Deal". "This is why we must develop a text that promotes combined transport, especially in countries where intermodal logistics is still in its infancy or where it could have a greater impact", Tosi added.

Logistics currently accounts for 8 percent of food company Danone's total greenhouse gas emissions, most of which arise from storage and transport. By 2030, the company aims to reduce 800.000 tonnes of greenhouse gases in logistics compared to 2020 most of which will come from increased use of Combined Transport.

# Hungary: new intermodal terminal to be built in Szeged

### Poland: major extension to terminal capacities

PKP Cargo, the Polish state-owned rail freight company, will make land available to those wanting to develop terminals throughout Poland to ease the country's terminal capacity shortage, while selling its shares in the Sławków and Medyka terminals. The contract to expand Euroterminal Sławków has in the meanwhile been signed by the Voivodship of Silesia and the central government. The Gadki terminal, in western Poland, will also get an upgrade. Gadki will get remote-controlled RMG portal cranes of the latest generation, a larger operational area, as well as longer and new tracks for 750-metre trains.
